She has written several book chapters, including two on discrimination and has appeared on Dateline, NBC to discuss discrimination.

Professor Goldberg has taken on a number of leadership roles within her profession. She recently completed a three-year term as Associate Editor of *Group and Organization Management*, a leading peer-reviewed journal, and is currently on the editorial boards of three top refereed journals. As such, she is abreast of very current developments in all areas of Human Resource Management and has a wealth of experience evaluating and critiquing research, an important skill in discrediting other witnesses. Caren was recognized last year by the Society for Human Resource Management, as one of the 100 thought leaders (from business, consulting, government, and academia) in the area of Diversity and Inclusion.
